

eID


eID is a DIGITAL building block to enable the mutual recognition of national electronic identification schemes (eID) across borders.


Collaboration with 3rd countries (TCs)

Context

Formal request received from 3rd countries

Recognize TC electronic signatures as eIDAS AdES

Recognition of 3rd countries' eSignatures as eIDAS AdES

Preparation of **Third Countries AdES LOTL** pointing to a 3rd country's Trusted List (TL)


To allow any party to:

- Download and authenticate the TC trusted list;
- Validate TC-QES as elDAS AdES, using the Mutual Recognition Agreement (MRA) element.

QES equivalence can only be achieved between Member States and a 3rd country only via an agreement under Article 14 of the eIDAS regulation


MRA element defines **technical equivalence** between the UA framework and the eIDAS framework.

- Equivalence statements are defined within the AdES LOTL
- Machine-processable




Collaboration with 3rd countries disclaimer

- European Commission has constructed the Third Countries (TC)
 AdES LOTL that currently is pointing only to the UA TL
- European Commission has prepared the current framework in order to facilitate the technical validation of third countries' electronic signatures to MS. It is under the responsibility of the MS to decide whether the signatures coming from these countries comply with all requirements for being used in their online services.
- European Commission doesn't bear any liability about the security nor the practices, third countries are following in the eSignature business domain.

Inter-Institutional TL in TL-Browser

 $\mathbf{3}^{\text{rd}}$ parties will be able to validate the certificates issued by the EU Institutions, Bodies and Agencies



Inter-Institutional TL in TL-Browser

3rd parties will be able to validate the certificates issued by the EU Institutions, Bodies and Agencies (EUIBAs)

The TRUST group of the inter-institutional committee for the Digital Transformation in the EUIBAs (ICDT-DI) decided to proceed on the **technical implementation of an inter-institutional TL.** Legal commitment is still to be defined/agreed between the EUIBAs.


This TL is going to be available in a public location from the European Commission and included in the TL-Browser
